### LDT Intramural Program Rules

#### Non-Eligible Players

- The only child not eligible to play on a LDT intramural team is one who currently plays on a travel soccer team, regardless of town in which they play travel soccer.
  - LDT Directors of each participating LDT club will ensure a note is added to their registration system stating that travel soccer players are not eligible to play.
  - LDT Directors will monitor their own LDT club registrations to insure no travel players register for the LDT intramural program.
  - In past years, players have played travel soccer for one club and then registered to play LDT intramural for another Club. To ensure this doesn't occur LDT Directors will review their registrations for any player who is registering from an outside town. If a player registers from an outside town, it is the responsibility of the LDT Director to send a note to the LDT Director of the outside town confirming the player in question does not play for a travel soccer team. Ex. If Poughkeepsie notices a Hopewell Junction/Fishkill address, the Poughkeepsie LDT Director would send a note to the East Fishkill LDT Director to inquire. Since some towns overlap, each LDT Director may ask additional LDT Directors to review.
  - Any travel soccer player identified during a game will be asked to leave the field, be removed from the roster and the club will be reported to the Disciplinary Committee for further review and disciplinary action.

#### Rosters

- Rosters will be required for each game and players will be checked in by the referees. Where possible, rosters will include pictures of the players.

### Medical Release

- Each coach must have a copy of the player's medical release form with them at each practice and game.

### Uniforms & Equipment

- Shin guards and appropriate footwear are mandatory.
- The home team is responsible for switching uniforms should a conflict in uniform color arise. If another uniform is not available, then the home team will wear pinnies.

### Referees

- Each game should utilize a three-person referee system. When this is not possible, the center referee should ask an adult to volunteer from each team to help with the sidelines, only alerting the center referee when the ball goes out of bounds. The volunteers should not assist the center referee in any other manner. The center referee for each game should be at least one year older than the division they are refereeing.

### Reschedules/Game Cancellations

- Games are to be played as scheduled. If a game time needs to be changed, then the team requesting the change will be responsible for contacting the other coach. If a game needs to be canceled for reasons other than inclement weather, then the team canceling the game should give the opposing team at least 24 hours notice of the cancellation.

### Inclement Weather/Extreme Temperatures

- In the case of inclement weather, the home team should alert the visiting team as soon as possible if fields are closed.
- Heat indexes are to be monitored. If the heat index is between 91 and 95, then the game will switch to quarters allowing players to re-hydrate. If the heat index is greater than 95, then the game will be cancelled and rescheduled.

### Field Safety

- Fields should be properly lined and corner flags are required for each game.
- Goals need to be held down with at least two stakes, ground-gripping anchors or sandbags while in use. If goals are not properly anchored, then the game will be cancelled and the home team will be charged with a forfeit. It will be the responsibility of the referee to determine if the goals are secure.

### Reporting Game Scores/Cards/Issues

- Each Sunday, the coach of the home team is to email the game score, any yellow/red cards issued and the name of the recipient, and any other issues observed at the game to [ehysl.ltd.gamereports@gmail.com](mailto:ehysl.ltd.gamereports@gmail.com). The subject of the e-mail should contain the division, the home and away teams, and the date (and time, if more than one game is played). For example, Subject: CU12, Beekman 11 v East Fishkill 3, 2017-09-16 11:30
- Any player receiving a red card in a game will not be allowed to play a minimum of their next one (1) scheduled match. The disciplinary committee will decide the actual number.

### Running Up Scores

- One of the purposes of the LDT program is to promote good sportsmanship. When teams are mismatched, coaches should consider various score limiting techniques.
- No goal differential in excess of 7 goals is acceptable. If any team exceeds the 7 goal differential the following will occur:
  - 1<sup>st</sup> offense – warning to coach and club
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> offense – one game suspension for the coach
  - 3<sup>rd</sup> offense – three game suspension for the coach
